If you are involved in a project or program that moves the community toward the 2040 Vision, you are encouraged to submit an Initiative. The Imagine Corvallis Action Network (ICAN) Advisory Board will then review your Initiative to determine its validity.

Being part of the Imagine Corvallis Action Network means...

- Information about your project and your organization will become part of the efforts to make 2040 Corvallis the one we imagined.
- Visibility and recognition at Imagine Corvallis community events.
- Recommendations by the ICAN Advisory Board when seeking funding, sponsorships or other support, including use of the Imagine Corvallis 2040 logo
- An opportunity to request assistance from the ICAN Board to strengthen your project, further increase its visibility, bring in partners and other supporters, enhance funding potential, etc.

What happens after you submit your application?

- The ICAN Board will review your application to determine whether your project or program moves the community toward the 2040 Vision. If your project also implements the Corvallis Climate Action Plan, the Climate Action Advisory Board will also review your application.
- If accepted into the Vision 2040, information about your project and organization will be included on the Imagine Corvallis 2040 website.
- The ICAN Board may offer assistance with locating funding for your project, identifying potential partners or sponsors.
- You will be asked to periodically report your project's progress.
